LONDON, May 14. — The two men-Boulton and Parke—who were arrested at Surrey Theater for dressing in female apparel and otherwise disguised, were brought up to-day for examination. The prosecution announced that they would publish criminating letters in the case. Bail was required. An immense crowd is surrounding the court, hooting the prisoners.

The Government announces that Peter Barret, a Fenian, will be tried again for the third time.
