The price for an additional single day added to the 3 day minimum is 1/3rd of the three day cost. Inn assignments will not be made for partial Fairs until after September 1.

Note: the double occupancy* rate applies only if the room is occupied by two persons. If you sign up for a double room, but no one takes the other half, you may be asked to move or pay the single rate. We have a new Inn in the heart of town with large bright rooms for singles, doubles or couples**, as well as three apartment Inns.


About Fantasia Fair

Fantasia Fair was conceived in 1974 by members of a club called the Cherrystones of Boston. Fantasia Fair I (1975) had about 40 participants. From this humble beginning the Fair has evolved, each program building on the previous one, expanded or modified to incorporate the many changing facets of the crossgender lifestyle. The Fair is, basically, a holiday experience for the crossdresser and crossgender community. It is a mix of practical, social, and educational opportunities designed to help in the personal growth and heightened awareness of one's own "femme" persona. Included in this smorgasbord of activities are the beauty programs, seminars, workshops, house parties, awards banquets, fashion show, fantasy ball and our own special talent show.
