ENGLAND. Lonnon, May 9.—Boulton and Park,

two of the parties implicated in the women personation affair, which created so much excitement last summer, and the details of which roused popular indignation to the highest pitch, surrendered themselves a short time since to the authorities for trial. It will be remembered that these men, at the time of the capture and trial of their more aristocratic accomplices, Lord Clinton and James Safford Fisk, United States Consul at the port of Leith, in Scotland, could not be found and for a long time contrived so well to guard the secret of their hiding place as to baffle and elude the utmost vigilance of the police. At last, finding escape impossible, they delivered themselves up. The trial of the criminals commenced here to-day. They are charged with an unnatural crime. Mr. Colridge, counsel for the crown, opened the case for the prosecution. The proceedings will doubtless develop details of an excessive prurient and revolting nature. The court was crammed at the opening this morning, thousands being present. The result is anxiously looked for.
