

Welcome to ETVC

Who we are... and how to find us.



ETVC (Educational TV Channel) is a social, recreational and educational support group for transvestites, transsexuals, transgenderists and their friends and/or Significant Others.

In the spring of 1982, a small group of cross-dressers and transgenderists in the San Francisco Bay area, wanting to create a safe social milieu for themselves, began getting together on a regular basis at various individuals' homes. We chose a name for our group (ETVC) and as word got around and more people started showing up at the gatherings, we established regular monthly socials at a San Francisco restaurant, the Chez Mollet. In less than a year, our "theme" parties or events were drawing an average of 40-60 people and ETVC had become established as one of the best places in the Bay area for TV's, TS's and TG's to go for a sociable night out on the town.

Starting in 1983, we began to adopt a set of bylaws to provide a formal structure for the group. Under these Bylaws, ETVC is a membership organization (although non-members who share our interests are welcome to attend) wherein responsibility for coordinating its activities rests with a 5-member Executive Committee.

Since we exist to help meet the needs of TV's, TS's and TG's, we are delighted to welcome new people who share our interests to any of our regular meetings which take place the last Thursday of every month at the Chez Mollet restaurant, 527 Bryant St., San Francisco, CA from 8 pm to 12 midnight. Their specialty is French cuisine and reservations are usually advisable. Directions to the Chez Mollet are on the back.

We would like to encourage all our friends, new and old, to become members of ETVC. On the reverse is a mail-in membership form for your convenience. Anyone can also become a member at the door on the night of any ETVC function. Reprinted below is the Statement of Purpose and membership eligibility criteria from our Bylaws.


STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of the "Educational TV Channel" (hereinafter "ETVC") is two-fold: (1) to serve the educational, social and recreational needs of transvestites (either female or male), transsexuals (either female or male), and all other persons (either female or male) whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex, and (2) to undertake educational activities intended to assist the general public in comprehending transvestism, transsexualism, and transgenderism.

MEMBERSHIP (Eligibility)

Membership in ETVC is open to any person (male or female) who is 18 years of age or older and who believes that he or she is, or may be, a (1) transvestite, (2) transsexual, or (3) person whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex. Membership is also open to (1) a spouse or significant other of one who is eligible for membership in ETVC under the preceding sentence, and (2) one who is 18 years of age or older and who has (a) a personal or professional interest in one or more persons who fall into one or more of the categories established in the preceding sentence, or (b) a personal or professional interest in transgenderism or gender dysphoria generally.

(BYLAWS adopted May 31, 1984)



DIRECTIONS

From the East Bay:

Take I-80 or I-580 to and across the Bay Bridge to the Fifth St. exit, turn left onto Fifth St. and left again onto Bryant St.

From north of San Francisco:

Follow US 101 across the Golden Gate Bridge and thru the city to I-80. Take the Fourth St. exit directly onto Bryant St. The Chez is straight ahead.

From the South Bay:

Take US 101 north to I-80 and the Fourth St. exit (as above). Alternatively, take I-280 to its end at Fourth St., cross over Fourth, go one block and take a left onto Third St. and go up 4 blocks to Bryant St.

MEMBERSHIP IN ETVC

Under the Bylaws, the membership year runs from June 1 to May 31. An annual membership is \$7.00 when purchased between June 1 and November 30, and \$4.00 when purchased between December 1 and May 31, and offers the following benefits:

- 1) reduced rate for parties;
- 2) a membership card which facilitates your entrance into our parties;
- 3) a subscription to the ETVC Newsletter which is published bi-monthly in June, August, October, December, February and April of each membership year;
- 4) free or reduced cost for other ETVC publications and services;
- 5) a say in how ETVC is run for your benefit: a vote for the members of the Executive Committee at the May Annual Meeting and the right to attend meetings of the ExComm.;
- 6) provides ETVC with funds needed to continue growing as a stronger and more supportive organization, able to offer more benefits and services to its members.



is spreading outwards like ripples on a pond as a result of our successful socials and expanding organization are resulting in an ever-increasing membership. Our membership has now reached the astounding figure of 120 which is probably twice as many as we had last year. (Records are uncertain as to just what last year's total membership figures were). This figure represents a growth of 14 new members in the last two month period alone, or nearly two new members each week during that time. This sort of response among our sisters out there is just tremendously satisfying. We can all take credit for this growth because, in attending the monthly parties, we have all helped create the safety, warm welcome and goodwill that touches other people's hearts and attracts them to us. The real significance of our membership, however, is not the size of the number but what it represents -- that many more people, often closeted and lonely, perhaps confused and scared, to whom we have been able to provide some measure of comfort, security and companionship and have given them a place wherein they could come out and feel good about themselves.

Also, don't forget -- the end of the ETVC membership year is May 31st. Effective June 1, 1985, all memberships in ETVC, regardless of when purchased, need to be renewed at the annual rate of \$7.00 for a full year of fun and good friendship. You will need to renew by the time of the June party in order to get into the party for the member fee. You can use the coupon in this Newsletter and renew by mail if that is more convenient for you. Significant Others Support Group

We are pleased to be able to report that our "Significant Others Support Group" has held its first meeting and 5 people attended - a wonderful turnout for a first-time meeting! All present felt the meeting went well, was very helpful for them and have agreed to continue meeting on a regular basis. They have set the first Tuesday of each month at 8pm as their meeting time and each session will last approximately two hours. The next two meetings are scheduled for May 7 and June 4. The Group is being facilitated by Arlene, a "significant other" of one of our members and who has had experience leading these kinds of support groups. You can call her at 415/ [REDACTED] for the location if you are interested in attending the next meeting.

The Group members define "significant other" (S.O.) as "wives, lovers, friends, children, other relatives and anyone else interested in or close to a TV/TS/TG person who are themselves **not** a TV/TS." They would like all the TV/TS/TG members of ETVC to encourage the Significant Others in their own lives to come to these meetings - particularly if the S.O. feels like they need or want some support from their peers in dealing with their feelings about the TV/TS in their lives. It is important to emphasize that all meetings are kept **strictly confidential** among the participants. This is to help ensure that a safe supportive environment is created in which all attendees will feel secure enough to really be able to share and talk about their feelings.

Couples Support Group

Our second support group, this one for couples (including the spouse or lover of a TV/TS) has experienced more difficulty getting started. Despite numerous efforts, not enough interest (there surely is need) has yet developed to enable this group to begin meeting. We certainly hope that ETVC can provide assistance to wives and girlfriends, whether through one of these groups or a channel yet undiscovered. We encourage those of you who feel you might benefit from sharing your feelings and fears with others in a similar situation to contact any officer and let them know you're interested in a support group.



Outreach Committee News

We are satisfied with the response to our recent advertising. At least 26 people contacted us in reply to our four-week ad in the Bay Guardian, and at least 6 have responded to our ad in the Transvestian. Of course, many of the people who write us asking for information, or who show up at a party for the first time, don't describe where they heard of us. Our reaching many of these people must be ascribed to the ever-widening ripples in the ocean of humanity that these and other outreach activities are (we hope) creating

We do not yet know the full results of our contacting the three professional therapists' associations, and we'll report on this in the next issue.

When we mailed the previous issue of the Newsletter, we sent a copy, along with a cover letter introducing ourselves, to each social group listed in the TV/TS Tapestry with whom we were not already corresponding. This amounted to about 55 organizations, including some eight or nine abroad. So far we have heard back from five: the Paradise Club of Cleveland, OH; the S.A.M.C. of San Antonio, TX; the Network of Waukesha, WI; the Phi Chapter of G.G.A. in Newark, DE; and the Chi Chapter of Tri-Ess in Chicago, IL.

ETVC Hostess & Greeters Committee


If ETVC has any reason for existing, it is to provide a safe, secure place where all TV/TS/TGs can feel like they belong while meeting others who share their interests and pleasures. It is up to all of us, particularly our long-time members, to make new members and guests feel welcome and accepted. In view of all the new people who have joined us in the last few months (26 new members since January 1st), this would seem to be a particularly important need. Some of these new members may not know anyone in ETVC and it may also be a new experience for some of them to be dressed and socializing with other cross-dressers outside the safety of their home.

To facilitate this, we are actively seeking members who will help welcome everyone to the monthly parties. "Greeters" are those who staff the front table at which we check members into the room and collect the party fees for the evening. Besides these duties, a greeter will welcome everyone, with special attention to new members, friends and guests, answering their questions and ushering them to one of the hostesses.

A "Hostess" will spend some time at each party circulating between tables, introducing people to those whom they don't know and helping all members get to know each other better. She will pay special attention to newcomers, welcoming and helping them feel at ease and introducing them to other members - particularly to members who live in the same area.

The reward will be the good feelings you'll get as you help create a relaxed, sociable atmosphere for everyone at the party and thereby make a big contribution to the quality of the ETVC experience for all of us. It is also a nice opportunity to practice and experience your femininity in a social setting as you help people meet each other.
