Cross-dressing bank robber strikes again

A cross-dressing bandit stole an undisclosed amount of cash Tuesday afternoon from a Firstar Bank in the St. Paul skyway, then walked past a uniformed police officer who was ringing a Salvation Army bell outside the bank. FBI and St. Paul police officials said the male suspect, who is about 5-foot-5, slender and in his late 30s, might be the same man who robbed a U.S. Bank in the St. Paul skyway on Dec. 12.

"I don't think we've had anyone robbing banks in this kind of attire before," said Paul McCabe, an FBI special agent who said the robber is clearly trying to pass himself off as a woman. In fact, the Firstar teller thought the suspect was a woman when he walked into the bank at 101 E. 5th St. about 1:20 p.m. Tuesday.

In both robberies, the suspect claimed to have a gun, but no one saw a weapon. In the most recent robbery, he showed the teller a red-and-white checked dish towel that he claimed concealed a gun, and he whispered: "This is a robbery."

McCabe said the St. Paul police officer in the skyway was unaware of the robbery when the suspect walked past him carrying a purse filled with the stolen cash.

Woman Fights for Right to Be Mr. Claus

Donna Underwood wanted a job depicting Saint Nick for the tots in her West Virginia town. Then she found out the mall's hiring policy had a Santa clause.

"The mall said they couldn't have a female Santa," Underwood said Thursday. "They said mythically Santa is a man."

Underwood, 50, of Mount Hope, has filed a sexual discrimination lawsuit

against SantaPlus of St. Peters, Mo., which hired her to play Santa Claus at the Crossroads Mall in Beckley. She said the company fired her after one of the mall's managers complained about having a female Santa.

Underwood said she was the spitting image of a male elf, once she donned the Santa suit and put on the white beard and wig.

"I lowered my voice," she said. "I'm already a fairly heavyset person."

Underwood's career in the workshop was brief. She only got her big break a year ago, about this time of year, when a gender-correct Santa didn't show up for work. She was working at a T-shirt shop at the time, but filled in one day for the ailing elf.

She applied for a Santa job this year and was hired by SantaPlus.

"I like kids," she said. "I like to see their faces when they list what they want."

But her stint again only lasted one day, Nov. 11, and then she was fired.

"I was upset," she said. "It's the first time I've ever been fired from any job. It's kind of embarrassing. Everybody knew about it."

Underwood said SantaPlus let her work as a lesser, helper elf at the mall's Santa display, but she quit after a few days because it wasn't the same.

Underwood's lawyer, Cynthia Evans of Charleston, filed the lawsuit in Raleigh County Circuit Court against SantaPlus and company district manager Donna Hamby. The lawsuit accuses them of sex discrimination and seeks reinstatement, back pay and unspecified damages.

Evans said SantaPlus knew Underwood was a woman when she was hired. Nor Sewell, director of administration for SantaPlus, declined to comment on the lawsuit. Cathy Shumate-Housh, marketing director of the Crossroads Mall, also declined to comment.

Underwood said the male Santas now working at the mall don't have the right stuff to play the jolly old elf. They're too young for the role and they don't act like Santa. "They don't have a good 'Ho, ho, ho," she said.

Winn-Dixie Crossdresser Files Sex Discrimination Suit

NTAC Calls for Boycott of 'Image' Concious Retailer

Imagine your place of employment notifies you that you're being fired. When you ask their reason, the reply is, "we didn't like what you wore at home the other night." Far-fetched? Not in the eyes of Peter Oiler. And not in the eyes of Winn-Dixie, Inc. - the sixth largest supermarket chain in the nation. Peter Oiler, an 21 year employee with Winn-Dixie's suburban New

Orleans distribution center, was fired for being a crossdresser.

The retailer claims that having Oiler, a truck driver with a good employment record on the job, was "bad for Winn-Dixie's image," said Eric Ferrero, ACLU's attorney of note on the case. It wasn't because of his violating company regulations, wearing female attire at work, or acting effeminately in the workplace. It was simply because he was honest with his supervisor; honest about wearing women's attire away from the workplace.

Two years ago, Oiler had griped to his boss about rumors that he was gay. During a review this past year, the supervisor inquired as to why that bothered him so much. Peter Oiler matter-of-factly answered: "Because I'm not gay. I'm transgendered." After the supervisor contacted the corporate office, he asked Oiler for his resignation; mentioning it "was bad for the corporate image." Oiler refused to resign, and two months later, he was fired. Thus the 45-year old, married, heterosexual male finds himself the center of a federal lawsuit brought against the retailer. Last month, Peter Oiler filed a federal lawsuit claiming sex discrimination. The basis for the complaint is that female employees of Winn Dixie wore men's clothes off duty without consequence. But the company fired him "because he failed to conform to the corporation's stereotyped notions of how a man ought to look and act."

"I never expected Winn-Dixie to approve of my personal life or to punish me for it," said Oiler. "I just never thought it had any bearing on how I do my job." "Performance was not an issue," stated Courtney Sharp, a transgender activist from New Orleans. "Crossdressing was."

The National Transgender Advocacy Coalition (NTAC) has thrown its full support behind the efforts to have Peter Oiler reinstated. NTAC sees an individual's freedom to express themselves in their personal lives as a basic human right. Transgenders face enough discrimination when transitioning in the workplace: having someone terminated for this reason when it is completely unrelated to their job is outrageous.

NTAC calls for Winn-Dixie, Inc. to reconsider their actions; which go far beyond an employer's normal sphere of influence, to dictating how an individual should live their personal life away from the workplace. To that point, NTAC is calling for a boycott of all Winn-Dixie Stores in the nation; and has plans for protests in some strategic Winn-Dixie locations. Additionally, NTAC encourages everyone to take a proactive stance by writing Winn-Dixie's corporate offices and expressing your displeasure over the unfair termination.
