

GLENN'S BROTHER

Reported to be in Court But Could Not be Located.

Parkersburg, W. Va., July 15.—Another day of the Ellis Glenn case has been concluded and the woman is still as mysterious as ever. The main evidence today was given by Hillsboro witnesses, who testified that the witness drank whisky with them and visited gambling houses.

Quite a surprise was sprung when it was reported that E. B. Glenn, the much wanted man, was in the room, but an investigation failed to locate him. The state asked to be allowed to examine the prisoner's head to determine whether there was a scar there. The judge would not allow it.

The charge of forgery has been lost sight of in the effort to prove the identity of the prisoner. The rubber trap-pings worn by Glenn when she was sent to the penitentiary in Illinois were produced today by one of the witnesses from Illinois. The end is no where in sight and the trial may last many days.

It is understood that the attorneys for Ellis Glenn had a conference and discussed the appealing of the habeas corpus proceedings which were dismissed in the United States court by Judge Jackson last winter. This would stop the trial in Criminal court, where it is, until the writ of habeas corpus heard by Judge Goff.
