SECRETARY

1. Record minutes of the board of directors.

2. Maintain a master draft of the Constitution and By-Laws. Incorporate into the master document all amendments so that said master draft shall be a complete text of the constitution and by-lays as amended.

- 3. She shall hold backup copies of all membership records, rosters, etc.
- 4. Keep a record of all outgoing correspondence.
