CONVENTION '87 UPDATE

The First International TV/TS Convention will be held March 4-9, 1987, at the Holiday Inn O'Hare, Chicago. The convention will be an important educational event for the TV/TS community, the people who serve us, and those interested in and affected by us. All those who understand the nature of the convention and are willing to comply with security and code of conduct requirements (i.e. good manners, common sense, etc.) are invited to attend.

The convention registration fee is \$150/person, or \$225/M-F couple. Discounts of 20% for payment by October 6, 1986, and 10% for payment by January 5, 1987, are being offered for the convention registration only. Registration includes all sessions, meals, receptions, shows, and banquet. Most planned activities run from Thursday evening (March 5) to Sunday morning (March 8).

Hotel accommodations are \$50/person/night, double, and \$100/person/night, single. The hotel is near the airport, and we have reserved a large portion of the facility.

An Editorial

Is Your "Gender Issue" Really the Issue?

I eavesdrop on a lot of conversations. Not being nosy, just listening to stay in tune with what's going on. I hear about a lot of difficulties, confusion, and issues. I also hear a lot about the very basics of human relationships and what it takes to have one's life work.

For example, in hearing one person recount a recent dilemma, she herself came to the conclusion that she had a time management and a communication problem-- and neither had anything to do with gender. A horde of consultants make decent money teaching top executives to deal with these problems.

Another comment came from a reputable therapist in the gender community. She said one of the key skills that many of her clients lack is the ability to manage risk. Risk management is hardly the private turf of gender-challenged people. It includes having relationships, children, investments, and playing the lottery.

A third example comes from a person who reported that she had all her life goals and plans well-defined-- and wham!-- something unexpected came up and blew the plan out of the water. Nothing gender-specific here either. How many times has your picnic been rained on?

Perhaps our difficulty, confusion, and issues really stem from paying attention to the wrong things. When we overstate our gender situation, we might well be understating the importance of applying basic life management skills.

If there is merit in this notion, then there is probably more to be gained from taking a series of courses in life management skills than running the meter in a therapist's office, sitting around complaining about how your life isn't working, or creating an epic drama about your profound gender issue.
