

TRANS- SEXUALS VICTORY

The San Francisco Gay Activists Alliance voted to allow people classified as transsexuals to join the organization last week.

The issue arose after a transsexual claimed he had been turned away from the homosexual Society for Individual Rights, when seeking help, because he was "not homosexual nor a member of SIR."

GAA President Ray Broshears announced that GAA would not work with the police-run transsexual group which is headed by SFPD Officer Elliot Blackstone. "For any Gay person to work with the SFPD at a time like this, when they are using the Gays as the election year scapegoat, would be the same as a Jewish person helping the American Nazi Party down in Pacifica," Rev. Ray pointed out.

A SF police officer, president of the Officers for Justice, a group opposed to the Police Officers Association and the Blue Coat Committee, told the gays recently that police harassment of the homosexual has just begun, because it is an election year, Broshears reported.

GAA announced that a listing of businesses and organizations oppressing the homosexual shall be printed monthly in the GAA Newsletter. Rev. Broshears said that the first list was approved and heading the list was the Advocate, followed by Unity, the MCC publication; the Alan Stanford Modeling Group, "Dial-a-Model"; Mr. J. Brian and Associates; the San Francisco Police Officers Association; the Adonis Bookstore; the Nob Hill and Tom Kat Theatres; the Vector Magazine; the Grubstake I & II; the 181 Club; the Capri, the Sexual Freedom League; the Eureka Valley PCR Council; the Psychedelic Venus Church; and the S.F. Good Times.
