

Death penalty to be sought in Middlesex triple homicide

NEW BRUNSWICK — Middlesex County officials will seek the death penalty for two Brooklyn men accused of shooting two South Brunswick men and a 7-year-old girl execution-style and setting their house on fire, Thomas J. Kapsak, second assistant prosecutor, said yesterday.

Middlesex Superior Court Judge George Nicola yesterday denied bail to the accused men — Felix Rodriguez Diaz, 23, and Pedro Juan Concepcion, 24 — at a late-morning arraignment.

The two men pleaded not guilty to three counts of murder even though court records filed yesterday indicate Concepcion, who was picked up by New Jersey authorities in his North Brooklyn apartment early Thursday morning, confessed to the killings just

before his arrest by South Brunswick Police Detective Joseph Boguszewicz.

Diaz was implicated in Concepcion's confession, according to the documents.

DIAZ AND Concepcion did not have legal counsel during their appearance before Nicola, and are expected to be represented by the
