In keeping with the educational philosophy of Fantasia Fair, we are pleased to announce that we will have closed curcuit video taping of many aspects of the Fair. This will enable participants to view themselves in movements and poise en femme.

In covering the Fair via the video medium, it is our intention to prepare a composite, coherent video tape presentation of the Fair. This will be shown to legitimate Paraculture social-contact groups throughout the USA, and to interested helping professional organizations to illustrate one of the more important programs offered by the Outreach Institute.

If you are interested in being part of this video production, we must have a sighned release from you at the start of Fantasia Fair.

The video production is sponsored by the Outreach Institute and Larry Budner, Professor of Media Communication at Rhode Island College. He has been our media specialist at both Fan/Fair 1979 & 1980. Together, with assistance from Maxine M. and DeeDee J., the Institute has prepared a video tape of Fan/Fair 1980. The tape will be made available for screenings during the Fair. This year, Larry, Maxine and DeeDee will be involved in taping, editing and preparing the final version of Fan/Fair 1981 a video presentation.

Finally, it is our objective to produce a quality video documentary on the Paraculture. Included in this documentary will be selected segments of Fan/Fair, and other facetts of Paraculture behavior and lifestyles.
