I attended an event like the Gender Fair last year and found it very interesting and fruitful for my understanding of the many variants on the gender continuum. There were a few other Tri-Ess members in attendance. Because of a wedding in the family, I could not attend this year's event.

LET'S TALK OUTREACH

Recently Shelley, Lori and I were invited to present an outreach program at Elgin Community College by Barbra Getz to her Sociology class. There were about 20-25 students in the class and of course Shelley and I went in hoping we would have a receptive and kind group facing us. But on our car ride to the college we both set aside our nervousness and decided to just be ourselves. We both believed that if we spoke from our hearts and accepted people for however they chose to process this information we would pass on, then surely we had to succeed.

When we arrived, Barbra introduced us to the class and Lori began a synopsis of her transgender role and her feelings. She also gave the group some background on the transgender spectrum and how each cross-dresser is traveling his/her journey at a different place on that spectrum. Shelley took her turn explaining her experience of her transgender role and her marriage. And finally I talked about my experience as a spouse of a cross-dresser.

After each of us finished speaking, the floor was open for questions from the class. Barbra had asked each student to prepare three questions to ask us. Within a two-hour period, we had experienced a very open and relaxed group asking a wide variety of questions. Some were serious and some made us laugh. Some of the students came up to us to talk after the question period and gave us some very positive feedback. They agreed with me that it takes a lot of courage to "come out" as a cross-dresser and present this expression of Self to a non-accepting society. Barbra quoted a student as saying, "I was apprehensive at first sight of the cross-dressers, but once I asked them questions and heard them speak I felt comfortable and saw past what they were wearing." The students were also impressed with my presence at the outreach from spouses' point of view. They felt I brought a human quality to the forum that helped them connect with the transgender issues.

I would like to see more spouses and significant others get involved with the outreach programs at the colleges. These college students are the people to shape our society through the knowledge and understanding we provide. Most people have negative feelings because of ignorance about the transgender community. They can't see past the external appearance into the heart and soul of these real people who want only to express themselves as God created them. Unconditional love and acceptance means seeing past the outer appearance which sometimes seems very different and strange. Accepting people as they are may mean society might have to change or even admit they may need to be more open minded. Admit that we are all the same and no one is better than another, just created a little differently. Can you imagine what the world would be like if everyone loved each other unconditionally? Would the student gunmen in Colorado have become so enraged with anger if their peers accepted them unconditionally? Where does prejudice and hatred end and love begin? From within each and every one of us!
