NEW YORK, October 17th. The National Board of Trade to-day, after an animated discussion, adopted a report of the special committee condemning the system of cornering markets and calling on the banks to discourage loans to parties so engaged.

The committee which conferred with the Canadian delegate reported a resolution that the Executive Council memorialize Congress for an appropriation for a commission to act in conjunction with the State Department in negotiating a treaty with Great Britain for reciprocal trade with Canada on a liberal basis, which shall also include the enlargement of the Canadian canals by the Government of Canada and the right of American vessels to navigate said canals on the same conditions with the Canadian vessels. The resolution was made the order of the day for to-morrow. Adjourned.

The grand jury of the Oyer and Terminer Court to-day presented two indictments against members of the riug, whose names have not yet transpired.

It is reported that the Herald is about to issue a German edition.

Five hundred cigar-makers are on a strike for higher wages.
