She believes this is a reason why she feels so united with the people in the Provincetown church, many of whom have felt on the outside during their lives, or persecuted, or different. Before studying for the ministry, she was employed in the fields of social action and personal counseling.

Patience graduated from the Harvard Divinity School in June of 1987 and began serving as an interim minister at the First Unitarian Church in New Bedford. She was ordained there in December 1988 and subsequently accepted the position here in Provincetown. She is now also working on a Doctorate Degree in Psychology and Clinical Studies at Andover-Newton Theological School.

She lives with her son Bryant, age 16.
