Our women's group "PALS" and our Couples Group have helped relationships stay together. Our "New Comers Meeting" chaired by Dee Dee has continued its great work in helping the first timers feel comfortable and welcome. I would like thank her and her team, Amanda Lynn and Christine, for all the time and energy they have given to make these meetings a success.

We have been quite active this year with our Out Reach Programs at a number of colleges. Each year we are invited to speak to psychology students about the transgender community. The collages this year, both spring and fall quarters, were College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, Rock Valley Community College in Rockford, Loyola North Shore Campus in Evanston, Elgin Community College and Illinois School of Professional Psychology in Chicago. We also went out of state to Indiana to a college in North Manchester. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the members, both new and old, who help make these programs of educating the public on who we are a success. I have been very busy this year with answering our Hot-Line, E-mails and P. O. Box inquiries. It has been personally rewarding for me to help bring support and understanding to the crossdresser who maybe afraid to come out of their closet and to bring them the knowledge that they are not alone. I like to again thank my wife Linda for the help she has given in talking with the partner. I also want to thank Denise for filling in for me when I have been out of town. This is an area I would like some help this next year. If you are interested in giving some of your time please contact me. We would like to establish one day or evening each week and make it available for someone calling in on our Help-Line to be able to talk to one of us directly.

The Chi-Chapter board has been looking for reasons why our membership has fallen off over the past couple of years and why some news comers do not return. I believe that if we all continue to focus on the mission of Tri-Ess our membership will improve. We can not and should not be an organization for all transgender people, for we have a specific purpose and function. My hope is that a new comer, either the CD or their partner, who has attended our monthly meeting, will feel welcomed and accepted by the group and will want to come back. As they make friendships and gain support and knowledge from our members they will grow in time more comfortable and accepting of themselves or of their partner. I believe that these members will be are future for they will keep coming back because of the friendships they have make and will in turn give back support and friendship to the new members. There will always be some new comers, as there are some hot-line inquirers, who are not yet ready for our support, and there maybe some who feel they can travel this journey alone. We all can be proud of what our organization does for the transgender community. We help with the first steps on this journey called the Transgender Spectrum. The Questionnaire Report

We received 46 questionnaires. That shows a good amount of interest by many of our members. Thank you! Yet, less than 25% of the membership returned their form. I guess that proves the 80/20 rule: 80% will let the other 20% do the work. It shouldn't be that way, and I'm hoping the 80% will make a new millennium resolution to get more involved.

So what did people say? The variety of responses is quite diverse.

The responses confirm the need for a group like ours, and for our focus. Meeting nights, locations and cost seem to be agreeable to most. The internet plays a new and important role in getting out the word that we are out there, but perhaps is not the cause of decreased meeting attendance as one member commented: "CGS's attendance is not down" because of the internet. More people were favorable or were neutral on the programming than were in disagreement.

Femme tips and CD-knowledgeable speakers head the list of programs we should have more often. We have a lot of contacts in the community for speakers, but maybe you know someone too. Give us a name, we'll make the contact. Significant numbers confirm the need to keep spouses involved, and a good number need to have some forum for single/divorced CD issues.

Voice training and clinical/professional speakers scored the highest write-in for program types to have.

I'll let you read the rest.

Where do we go from here? Well I suggest that we look at these results starting in January and pick the most interesting items to follow up on. That should set our tone for the coming year.

The officers have been challenged in some of the comments, but so have all of YOU! A group like ours is only as good as the members are willing to make it. So expect to be called on to participate more in the coming year. Perhaps we can lower the 80/20 rule to 60/40, 50/50 or dare I dream on, 100% participation? Yes, I strongly think a requirement for membership should be that each member must participate in helping with something at least once a year. Participation should be part your dues to the group. Get ready to roll up those frilly sleeves girls.
