I want to thank, Rosemary and Paradise Club, for the uses of the article What's a 6.6.?. With the first Wife/Girlfriend meeting coming up this month I felt it was a timely article to reprint. For those that don't know 6.6. stands for Genetic Girl or Genuine Girl and refers to a person born as a woman with the body of a woman.

Over the last couple of months we have been very fortunate to have had several Doctor's / Counselors visit our meetings. All of these people have expressed the fact that they are happy that a group like this has finally formed in this area. They have a strong desire to work with us and to handle our kind of cases when one of us needs them. As Virginia Prince points out in one of her books, only about 4 to 6 out of every 100 cross-dressers as ever sought the help of a medical professional for cross-dressing related reasons. This tends to leave a big hole in the medical definition of what a cross-dresser is and what we are about. So, many of the doctors are seeking out group like ours, to get to know us and to find out what a "well adjusted" cross-dresser is like. We thank them for their strong interest and support of the kind of lives we need to live. I also encourage you to take advantage of their services if you feel you need counselling for either yourself or your wife/girlfriend/parent. Many doctors are not prepared to deal with the problems of gender identity so it is best to go to the ones that you know are interested, prepared and capable of dealing with these special needs.

This leads me to my next couple of topics. Judy is a psychology student, friend of mine, who has decided to try to do a study about cross-dressing. In particular she would like to work with us, in an effort to reach as many TV's and TS's as possible. In the next month or two I will be sending out a questionnaire and a consent form. The consent form must be signed and returned in order to participate in the survey, however the forms will be returned to me in sealed envelopes and retained by me. They will not be opened. Judy will be explaining the nature of the survey and how it will be handled in an up coming news-letter. I mention it now only so you can be thinking about whether you wish to

participate or not. If any of the other groups would like to be a part of this effort, please contact me.

George and Linda have been working with one of our members for some time. They have decided it is time to get some real life experiences and will therefore be attending many of our future meeting. George is a psychiatrist and has something he would like to offer to members in the group. He will be telling you more about it in a future "InnerView".

Yvonne, was visiting from the Chicago area and as treasurer for the National Convention spoke about what the plans for the convention are. The main point she addressed is that this is not a weekend for the people who only wish to party. This will be an educational convention aimed at the TV/TS communities and the professional people. Some of the seminars will qualify for CE credits and all of them will be handled on a very professional level. The cost is not cheap, but then quality never is, so do some careful thinking about how much this kind of convention means to you and what an impact it can have on the future quality our all our lives.
