Williamson Henderson — Reflections of 1994

"It's Not Easy Being Green" and It's even harder being an open, "out and about", community-activist *Gay*. 1994 rivaled 1969 and 1977 for *Williamson's* very Gay life. Now, there is also a 10-room, 4-level house in Long Island, a 4-room condominium apartment in Manhattan, a full-time NYC personnel agency business (ALLANTE PERSONNEL), 3 cars (instead of just the classic 1969 Caddy convertible) and a 5-year, body-builder lover, *Farrell Armstrong*. Also, 3 cats (the same amount as in '69, albeit different felines).

The Imperial Queens of New York & Long Island (... and New Jersey) started in early 1969 and was one of the catalysts for the Gay Revolution. On its silver anniversary, as Director, WILLIAMSON HENDERSON was guest speaker at various events not covered by his "stage sister", On ALLYSON ALLANTE. These engagements included the 25th Anniversary Reunion of the Stonewall (SVA) Veterans Association in June and the Gay Activists Alliance (GAA) in December. His Gay civil rights life and Stonewall involvement was greatly characterized in "Stonewall: Night Variations -- the Musical Play". He was interviewed for national American Public Radio. CBS "Evening News" interviewed WILLIAMSON on location --- at the Stonewall! Most recently, he filmed a sequence for the 1995 production "Stonewall: The Movie". All include reference to the legendary "Stonewall Car", impounded at The Stonewall and owned then and now by Mr. Henderson. The car with the Imperial Queens and Stonewall Vets in it, on it and next to it led the authentic (and ultimately "authorized") "Spirit of Stonewall March" up Fifth Av. on the gayest day in history: June 26, 1994.

Allante Personnel Agency, founded by Mr. Henderson in 1979, celebrated its 15th year. It not only advertises in mainstream print media but supports the Gay Community Services Center with ads and advertises in the Gay Yellow Pages and the Pink Pages as well. He has made it possible, affordable and convenient for endless Gays (and non-Gays) to live in this City of New York. Employees never pay a fee (clients do). He also provides advice and guidance free-of-charge. Letters of appreciation are up over 100% in '94.

The holiday season for way more than a decade is hard for anyone **Gay**, as everyone has lost comrades, friends, associates and even partners to the long **A.I.D.S. War.** We all must live on in a positive, productive, involved manner for all of them and for the living and growing **Gay Community** at large.

Williamson simply suggests: "Make the most of this holiday season and new year, just say 'NO' to drugs and alcohol, quit smoking, exercise and have a very healthy and happier 1995 -- Stonewall--26".
